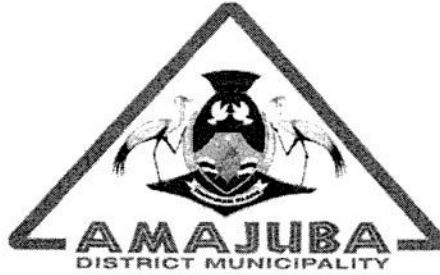

**TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF A TURNAROUND STRATEGY FOR**  
**POULTRY AND GRAIN PROJECTS**

## **INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND**

The LED department has identified grain and poultry industries as catalytic industries that can be used to grow the agricultural economy and create jobs.

### **1. BACKGROUND**

The Government has in the past embarked on a number of developmental policies and programs that inform the basis for addressing unemployment, poverty and inequality to promote inclusive and shared economic growth in the agricultural sector along the value chain. It is within this context that various sector departments and Amajuba District Municipality supported the establishment of poultry facilities across the District and grain production. Many of the poultry facilities are non-functional and the infrastructure has been left unutilised.

There is still an opportunity to revive some of these facilities and integrate their operations into a cluster approach rather than single, small operations that struggle to have meaningful impact in the industry. The biggest input cost that poultry producers have to deal with is animal feed. The main crop used for processing animal feed is maize, a major crop that is grown in the District.

A partnership between these two industries ensures that the District can engage in a strategy/ies that can see a holistic development of the entire poultry value chain and thus enabling the previously disadvantaged to enter the mainstream economies of poultry production, animal feed production and logistics support.

**The District is looking for service providers to conduct an assessment of the existing poultry facilities in the District as well as determine the grain production potential for the District to support the poultry industry and also exploit other grain markets that local farmers have not yet been exposed to.**

## **2. OBJECTIVES**

- 2.1 The objectives of the assessment are to determine the potential and viability of the existing, underutilised and non-operational facilities in the District;
- 2.2 Develop suitable turnaround strategies to operationalise these facilities.

## **3. THE TURNAROUND STRATEGY**

The turn-around strategy should encompass the development of agricultural production value chains focused on the grain (maize/beans) and poultry (with a focus on broilers rather than egg layers) industries. These are the two priority sectors for Amajuba District Municipality in which a lot of investment has been made and the Municipality would like to see some results.

## **4. SCOPE OF WORK/PROJECT ROLL-OUT**

The project should be rolled out following these phases:

### **4.1 Phase 1: Assessment of current production sites and potential for growth**

The desktop review will include examining all strategy documents relating to the grain and poultry programmes that have been implemented by Amajuba District Municipality and its counterparts. The review should include:

- 4.1.1 An assessment of the strategy.
- 4.1.2 Implementation.
- 4.1.3 Results achieved through implementation.
- 4.1.4 Gaps.

*The desktop review should also include an assessment of both the poultry and grain industries and their value chains. From such an analysis a recommendation will be made on how to approach the strategy of resuscitating both industries for the Municipality.*

### **4.2 Phase 2: Participants profiling and technical assessments, industry overview for both poultry and grain and value chain analysis.**

**4.2.1 Participants profiling, although not so different from a baseline study, it should look at broader topics which include:**

- 4.2.1.1 Demographics of the individual households in each target site,
- 4.2.1.2 Employment levels,
- 4.2.1.3 Income generation and income brackets for each household,
- 4.2.1.4 Youth and women unemployment,
- 4.2.1.5 Size of productive land available to each household, etc.

**4.2.2 On the crop production side of things, the service provider needs to provide guidance for the following assessments:**

- 4.2.2.2 Soil tests and soil profiling;
- 4.2.2.2 Climate patterns analysis for proper production planning and risk mitigation with an emphasis on climate change;
- 4.2.2.3 Profiling of production sites with regards to land distribution which will inform the positioning of infrastructure,
- 4.2.2.3 Verification of the production sites' sizes;
- 4.2.2.4 Development of maps which will take into account soil, topography and road infrastructure;
- 4.2.2.5 Analysis of historic data to get an idea of what works in the respective target areas;
- 4.2.2.6 Review and selection of suitable crop production systems with an emphasis on adopting sustainable agriculture practices;
- 4.2.2.7 Review and recommendation of monitoring technologies that can be used to monitor crop performance.

**4.3 Phase 3: Development of turnaround plans for both poultry and grain industries**

All the information collated in the above sections will be utilised to develop the turnaround plans for both grain and poultry industries.

The turnaround plans should be developed in a phased approach:

**Phase 1:** This phase will focus on the capacitation of primary production.

**Phase 2:** This phase will focus on building a platform for beneficiation.

**Phase 3:** This stage will explore the inclusion of retail outlets as part of the strategy to diversify target markets. This will look at the integration of the spaza shop system and establishment of a pilot retail site.

**4.4 Phase 4: Fund raising**

The turnaround plans that will be developed for both the poultry and grain business models will be used for fund raising. The fund raising exercise should focus on both grant and loan funding and will also take into account government plans around the two commodities in the target area to also access funds that might already be allocated to support operations.

#### **4.5 Phase 5: Implementation**

Implementation of the poultry and grain value-chains

The turn-around strategy will cover Phases 1-3. Phase 4-5 will be covered separately under fund raising from which the service provider will charge a fund raising and project management fees from the funds that will be solicited.

#### **5. SPECIAL CONDITION**

On phase 4-5, service provider will charge project management fees which will not exceeds 10% of the total project costs.



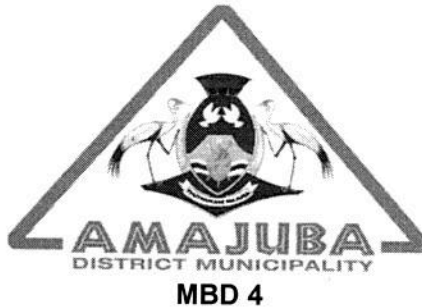

## PREFERENCE POINTS CLAIM FORM IN TERMS OF THE PREFERENTIAL PROCUREMENT REGULATIONS 2001

### PURCHASES

This preference form must form part of all bids invited. It contains general information and serves as a claim form for preference points for Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment (B-BBEE) Status Level of Contribution

#### 1. GENERAL CONDITIONS

1.1 The following preference point systems are applicable to all bids:

- the 80/20 system for requirements with a Rand value up to R50 000 000; and

1.2 The value of this bid is estimated not to exceed R50 000 000 and therefore the 80/20 system shall be applicable.

1.3 Preference points for this bid shall be awarded for:

- (a) Price; and
- (b) B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution

1.3.1 The maximum points for this bid are allocated as follows:

Separate Preference Points Claim Forms will be used for the promotion of the specific goals for which points have been allocated in paragraph 1.3.1.2 (b) above.

1.4 Failure on the part of a bidder to fill in and/or to sign this form and submit a B-BBEE Verification Certificate from a Verification Agency accredited by the South African Accreditation System (SANAS) or a Registered Auditor approved by the Independent Regulatory Board of Auditors (IRBA) or an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the Close Corporation Act (CCA) together with the bid, will be interpreted to mean that preference points for B-BBEE status level of contribution are not claimed.

- 1.5. The purchaser reserves the right to require of a bidder, either before a bid is adjudicated or at any time subsequently, to substantiate any claim in regard to preferences, in any manner required by the purchaser.

## 2.

### DEFINITIONS

- 2.1. **"all applicable taxes"** includes value-added tax, pay as you earn, income tax, unemployment insurance fund contributions and skills development levies;
- 2.2. **"B-BBEE"** means broad-based black economic empowerment as defined in section 1 of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.3. **"B-BBEE status level of contributor"** means the B-BBEE status received by a measured entity based on its overall performance using the relevant scorecard contained in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act;
- 2.4. **"bid"** means a written offer in a prescribed or stipulated form in response to an invitation by an organ of state for the provision of services, works or goods, through price quotations, advertised competitive bidding processes or proposals;
- 2.5. **"Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act"** means the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act, 2003 (Act No. 53 of 2003);
- 2.6. **"comparative price"** means the price after the factors of a non-firm price and all unconditional discounts that can be utilized have been taken into consideration;
- 2.7. **"consortium or joint venture"** means an association of persons for the purpose of combining their expertise, property, capital, efforts, skill and knowledge in an activity for the execution of a contract;
- 2.8. **"contract"** means the agreement that results from the acceptance of a bid by an organ of state;
- 2.9. **"EME"** means any enterprise with an annual total revenue of R5 million or less .
- 2.10. **"Firm price"** means the price that is only subject to adjustments in accordance with the actual increase or decrease resulting from the change, imposition, or abolition of customs or excise duty and any other duty, levy, or tax, which, in terms of the law or regulation, is binding on the contractor and demonstrably has an influence on the price of any supplies, or the rendering costs of any service, for the execution of the contract;
- 2.11. **"functionality"** means the measurement according to predetermined norms, as set out in the bid documents, of a service or commodity that is designed to be practical and useful, working or operating, taking into account, among other factors, the quality, reliability, viability and durability of a service and the technical capacity and ability of a bidder;
- 2.12. **"non-firm prices"** means all prices other than "firm" prices;
- 2.13. **"person"** includes a juristic person;
- 2.14. **"rand value"** means the total estimated value of a contract in South African currency, calculated at the time of bid invitations, and includes all applicable taxes and excise duties;
- 2.15. **"sub-contract"** means the primary contractor's assigning, leasing, making out work to, or employing, another person to support such primary contractor in the execution of part of a project in terms of the contract;

- 2.16 **“total revenue”** bears the same meaning assigned to this expression in the Codes of Good Practice on Black Economic Empowerment, issued in terms of section 9(1) of the Broad-Based Black Economic Empowerment Act and promulgated in the *Government Gazette* on 9 February 2007;
- 2.17 **“trust”** means the arrangement through which the property of one person is made over or bequeathed to a trustee to administer such property for the benefit of another person; and
- 2.18 **“trustee”** means any person, including the founder of a trust, to whom property is bequeathed in order for such property to be administered for the benefit of another person.

### 3. ADJUDICATION USING A POINT SYSTEM

- 3.1 The bidder obtaining the highest number of total points will be awarded the contract.
- 3.2 Preference points shall be calculated after prices have been brought to a comparative basis taking into account all factors of non-firm prices and all unconditional discounts;.
- 3.3 Points scored must be rounded off to the nearest 2 decimal places.
- 3.4 In the event that two or more bids have scored equal total points, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest number of preference points for B-BBEE.
- 3.5 However, when functionality is part of the evaluation process and two or more bids have scored equal points including equal preference points for B-BBEE, the successful bid must be the one scoring the highest score for functionality.
- 3.6 Should two or more bids be equal in all respects, the award shall be decided by the drawing of lots.

### 4. POINTS AWARDED FOR PRICE

#### 4.1 THE 80/20 PREFERENCE POINT SYSTEMS

A maximum of 80 points is allocated for price on the following basis:

#### 80/20

$$P_s = 80 \left( 1 - \frac{P_t - P_{\min}}{P_{\min}} \right)$$

Where

- $P_s$  = Points scored for comparative price of bid under consideration
- $P_t$  = Comparative price of bid under consideration
- $P_{\min}$  = Comparative price of lowest acceptable bid

### 5. Points awarded for B-BBEE Status Level of Contribution

- 5.2 Bidders who qualify as EMEs in terms of the B-BBEE Act must submit a certificate issued by an Accounting Officer as contemplated in the CCA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS or a Registered Auditor. Registered auditors do not need to meet the prerequisite for IRBA's approval for the purpose of conducting verification and issuing EMEs with B-BBEE Status Level Certificates.
- 5.3 Bidders other than EMEs must submit their original and valid B-BBEE status level verification certificate or a certified copy thereof, substantiating their B-BBEE rating issued by a Registered Auditor approved by IRBA or a Verification Agency accredited by SANAS.
- 5.4 A trust, consortium or joint venture, will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as a legal entity, provided that the entity submits their B-BBEE status level certificate.
- 5.5 A trust, consortium or joint venture will qualify for points for their B-BBEE status level as an unincorporated entity, provided that the entity submits their consolidated B-BBEE scorecard as if they were a group structure and that such a consolidated B-BBEE scorecard is prepared for every separate bid.
- 5.6 Tertiary institutions and public entities will be required to submit their B-BBEE status level certificates in terms of the specialized scorecard contained in the B-BBEE Codes of Good Practice.
- 5.7 A person will not be awarded points for B-BBEE status level if it is indicated in the bid documents that such a bidder intends sub-contracting more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not qualify for at least the points that such a bidder qualifies for, unless the intended sub-contractor is an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.
- 5.8 A person awarded a contract may not sub-contract more than 25% of the value of the contract to any other enterprise that does not have an equal or higher B-BBEE status level than the person concerned, unless the contract is sub-contracted to an EME that has the capability and ability to execute the sub-contract.

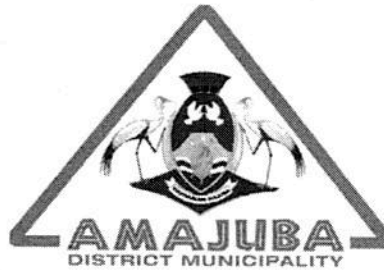
